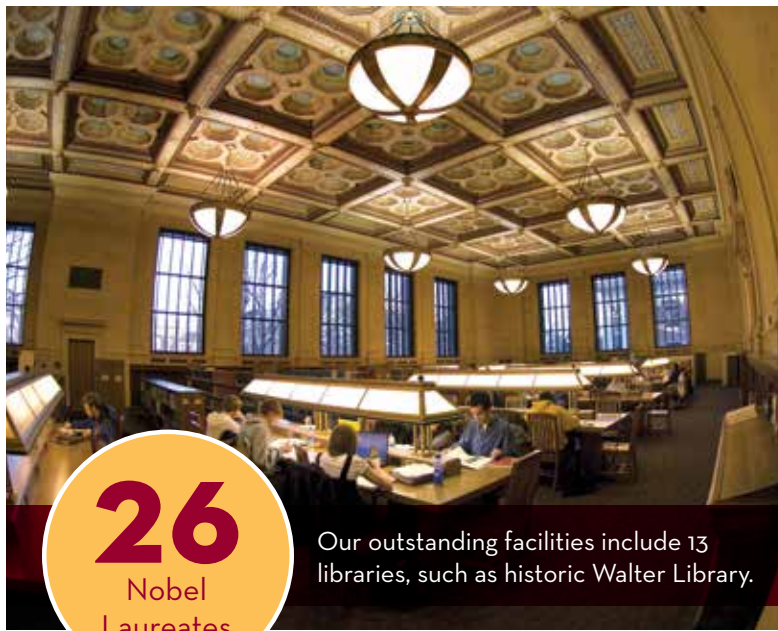

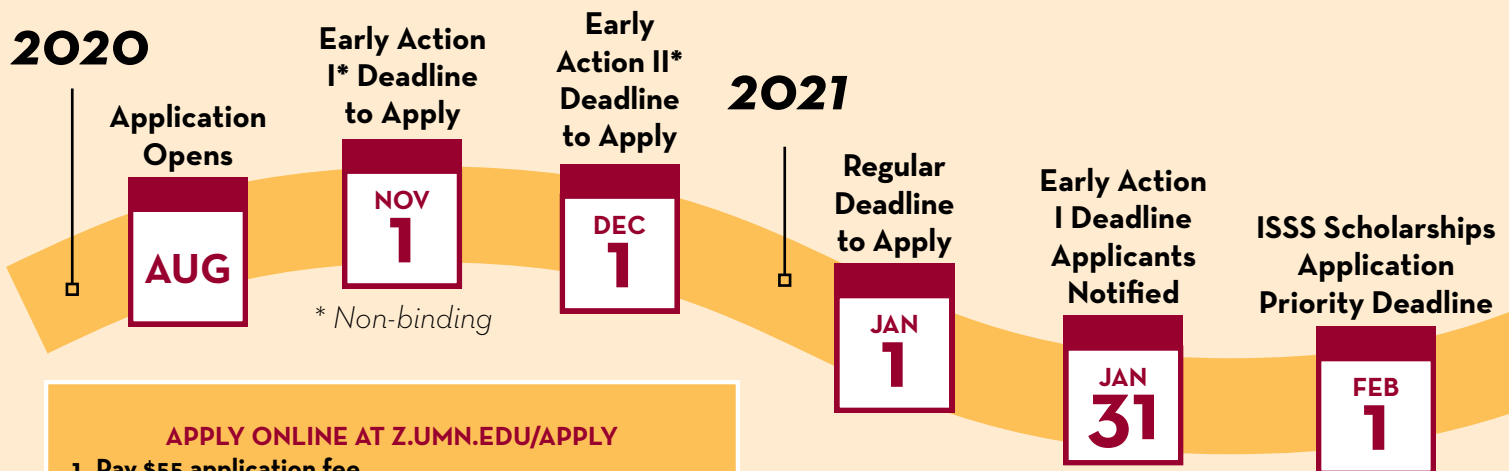
SCHOLARSHIPS

Global Excellence Scholarships (GES) are competitive, merit-based scholarships awarded to international freshmen or transfer students for up to four years at \$25,000, \$15,000, or \$10,000 per year.

Undergraduate Research Opportunities Program (UROP) Scholarships are awarded to high-achieving students with an interest in research. Recipients participate in faculty-sponsored research for one year, and they will receive approximately \$1,700 in 2020-2021.

International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) Scholarships are awarded based on financial need, academic merit, and diversity. Last year, the awards ranged from \$5,000 to \$1,000 per year, for up to four years.

1. Pay \$55 application fee
2. Self-report high school (9th-12th grade) courses and grades
3. Self-report English proficiency test score (z.umn.edu/intlenglish)

Note: ACT/SAT scores are not required

HOLISTIC REVIEW OF APPLICATIONS

Admission decisions are based on a very careful, overall assessment of each student's academic preparation and performance, as well as the additional information provided in the application, based on the academic and context factors listed at z.umn.edu/intladminfresh. No single factor is the deciding factor in the decision. The University of Minnesota does not have automatic criteria or minimums (cut-offs) for admission.

AP, IB, AND A-LEVEL CREDITS

Students in IB programs may receive eight semester credits for most higher-level subjects passed with a grade of five or higher. AP scores of three or higher may earn credits. Some A-Level or AS-Level courses may also receive credits. For more, see z.umn.edu/transferecredits.
