2023–2024 Guide for International TRANSFERSTUDENTS



Undergraduate transfer students are admitted to a particular college or program, each of which has its own admissions requirements. In general, transfer applicants must have completed (or be completing) at least 26 semester credits at the time of application.

COLLEGE-SPECIFIC TRANSFER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Transfer applicants are considered for admission based on an individual review of their applications by the college to which they are applying. Each application is reviewed using academic and context review factors (see list on website below), in addition to any program-specific criteria such as prerequisite courses and credit requirements. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT TRANSFERRING TO THE UMN

When can transfer students begin at the UMN?

 Most transfer students are admitted for the Fall term, which begins in September each year. Some majors also admit transfer students in the Spring term, which begins in mid-January. See the other side of this flyer for each program's deadlines.

Are there scholarships for international transfer students?

 International transfer students may be eligible for the merit-based Global Excellence Scholarship, which is usually awarded to students entering in the fall semester. Scholarships for students beginning in spring are rare. Awards are based on available funding.

What credits and grades will the UMN accept?

- The University of Minnesota awards general credit for grades of C or higher. Courses with a D grade will not be used to meet college major requirements.
- The timeline to complete a degree varies depending on how a student's transfer courses fulfill the Liberal Education (LE) requirements and the college or major requirements toward the bachelor's degree. Even if students have completed 2 years of university coursework, it may take 3 years or more to complete their degrees because of their LE and major course requirements.
- Regardless of the number of transferable credits, a student must take a minimum of 30 semester credits at the UMN in order to complete a degree, including 24 credits taken after admission to the student's major or program.
- The UMN does not accept credits from institutions that offer vocational or highly specialized courses, such as industry-based education programs. Remedial, developmental, and ESL courses are also not considered university level, transferable courses.
